

This PRIVATE RESIDENCE is a fragmented pyramid. The slots allow glass areas to extend up to the attic level, offering views from the second floor out to the Ocean. The slope of the pyramid continues the slope of the rocky point surrounding the house. The exterior is entirely white cedar shingles. Set back discreetly behind a band of trees - and weathered to a light gray - it is almost invisible from the water.

As a result of careful siting, a rock ledge serves as a protective “railing” between the living areas and the Ocean. Views out from the house feel unobstructed; at the same time, the structure never seems to intrude on its natural setting. The pyramidal forms are exposed on the interior, which is panelled in edge-grain fir. Flooring is slate and fir.
